







Since the early days of the colony when Gen. James Oglethorpe brought McIntosh and his clansmen from Scotland, people have prized the Georgia coast for its beauty and natural treasure. The lateriffs are tooking the Cathering the Peace are no exception. As captain of the Highland Company and Justice of the Peace, John McIntosh Mohr was the recognized leader of the Darien Settlement and the head of the Cattan/Chattan, or little cat, confederation of clans that included the McIntoshes, the McPhersons, the McGillivrays and others. He chose this western section of Darien for his trading post. Thus, oral histories tell us that the Cathead River was named for John McIntosh Mohr, the head of the cat.



Today, our downtown has entered a renaissance, where you will encounter our Historic District, a commercial waterfront, great shopping and dining, and lots of friendly souls. Every spring we honor our commercial fishermen with the annual Blessing of The Fleet Festival.




Where Every Riverhouse me is on the River...


